Music with Clapping Sticks




Clapsticks are a traditional percussive instrument used by men and women in all Indigenous Australian communities, usually to maintain rhythm during vocal chants.


After listening, see if you can participate with your clapsticks. Remember to try and clap on the beat.

-Transport-Then-and-Now

In the past, children had to walk everywhere. From home to school, to the park, to the shops and to see their friends or families. Only very wealthy families had cars and children didn't often get to ride in them. Do you like walking? Imagine if you had to walk everywhere, for everything! 




